

Abundant PublicTransport! Contrary to car dependent cities such as Los Angeles, it is not advisable to bring a car in San Francisco. However, if you must, remember to always budget in valet parking fees. The Renoir Hotel's triangular island is the only hotel in San Francisco fortunate enough to be surrounded by abundant public transit available except for the Cable Cars. With little creativity, guests can easily access every major attraction in the City as well as both SFO and OAK international airports for a fraction of the cost by taking advantage of our inexpensive, convenient, and effective mass public transit. Here is an aerial diagram of some of the attractions you can easily access from just outside our doorsteps. **Public Transport Helps: Save you money, Keep you healthy, and Protect the environment!**

Golden Gate Transit
The Golden Gate Transit travels across the Golden Gate Bridge and back. You can even enjoy: Sausalito, Stinson Beach, San Rafael, Marin and Sonoma County (Santa Rosa), Point Reyes, and Tiburon. Prices range from \$2.35 up to \$7.00 (one way) depending on your destination.

MUNI Bus Line #5 Fulton:
Takes you to Asian Art Museum, City Hall, Alamo Square (the Painted Ladies), University of San Francisco (USF), Golden Gate Park (DeYoung Museum & California Academy of Sciences), and Ocean Beach.

MUNI Subway and BART (Civic Center Station):
The MUNI is San Francisco's underground subway system transporting you within the city limits. You have direct access to AT&T Ball Park (home of the Giants), the Ferry Building and the Castro district. (MUNI Lines: J,K,L,M,N,S, and now T-Line). Transfers are also valid for MUNI buses, F-Line Streetcars. Note: Outbound is headed west and Inbound is headed east.

Underneath the MUNI is the Bay Area Rapid Transit (or BART). It takes you outside SF to Berkeley, Oakland, Fremont, and Daly City. On June 22, 2003, BART has been extended into SFO international airport. Now for less than \$6.00 one way, guests can simply hop on the BART and in less than 30 minutes, they are inside the international terminal of SFO airport. BART also goes to the Oakland Coliseum (A's) where you can transfer to AirBart for \$3. AirBart will take you to Oakland Intl. Airport. Cost of BART varies depending on the destination (from \$1.25 to \$7)

MUNI Bus Line #21 Hayes Valley:
Takes you to Civic Auditorium, Opera House, Davies Symphony Hall, Hayes Valley

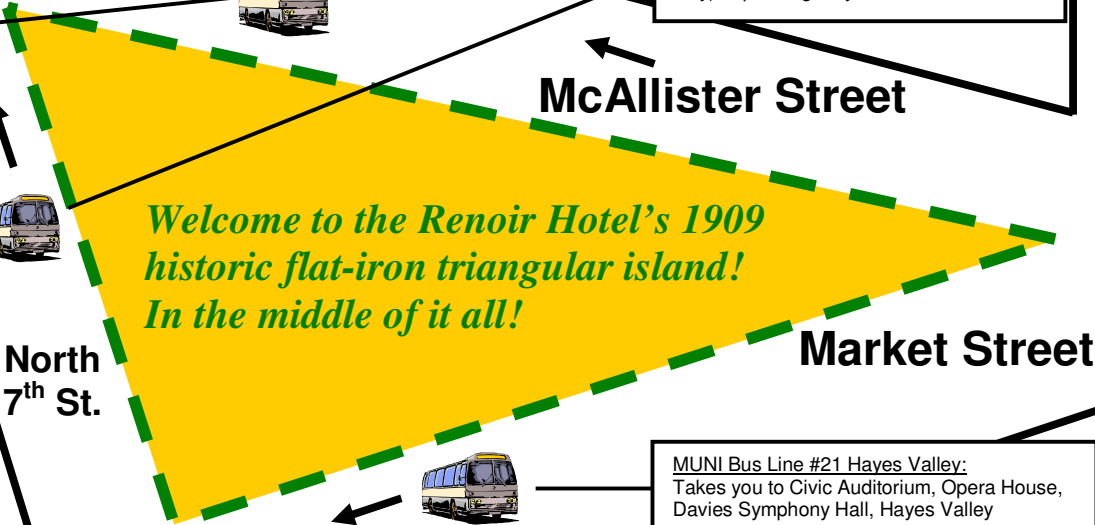
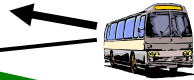
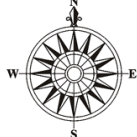
F-Line Historic Streetcars:

MUNI Buses are also available where the F-Line Streetcars drop off. One can take #7 or #71 to the Haight/Ashbury district or to Golden Gate Park.

Current Fares & Information (subj. to change):
MUNI Busses, Streetcars, and Subway \$1.50 per adult one way. Senior, ages 65+; Youth, ages 5-17: 35¢ Child, ages 4 and under: Free.
